The contents of the HIP field

Name of the HIP field: **Criminal Law**

Contents of the HIP field **Criminal Law** is focused on the investigation of partial issues of substantive criminal law and procedural criminal law with a special focus on issues that occur in these areas in application practice.

The content of the field is a detailed analysis of the issues in question, within which all methods of scientific work are applied, while the results of this investigation should represent an output applicable in the practice of relevant authorities operating in the field of criminal law.

The content of the field is also focusing on the investigation of criminological and criminal aspects related to the issues of criminal law, in order to achieve a comprehensive analysis of the partial problem of substantive criminal law and procedural criminal law.

Definition of the HIP field

The content of the HIP field is in accordance with the focus of the academic program Law, to which it is assigned. The content of the academic program is defined in such a way that it corresponds to the supporting topics of the knowledge core of the academic program Law. The main content elements of the HIP field are primarily:

- Development / demonstration of pedagogical skills;
- Development / demonstration of scientific work skills at the required higher level;
- Substantive law application contexts of criminal law;
- Procedural application contexts of criminal law;
- Criminological and criminal aspects and the context of partial issues of criminal law;
- International and European contexts of criminal law with a special focus on the context of judicial cooperation in criminal matters.
